Key Rules to Remember

- A determiner comes before a noun and tells us more about it — whether it is known or unknown, how many there are, or who it belongs to.
- Determiners include articles (a, an, the), possessives (my, your, her), interrogatives (which, what, whose), demonstratives (this, that, these, those) and quantifiers (some, many, few, several).
