



## Section A — Commas in a List

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1. We packed a tent sleeping bags and a torch for the trip.

✓ **Answer: We packed a tent, sleeping bags and a torch for the trip.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Tent, sleeping bags and a torch is correctly punctuated.*

2. At the campsite we saw rabbits foxes and deer.

✓ **Answer: At the campsite we saw rabbits, foxes and deer.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Rabbits, foxes and deer is correctly punctuated.*

3. We toasted marshmallows sang songs and told stories by the fire.

✓ **Answer: We toasted marshmallows, sang songs and told stories by the fire.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Marshmallows, sang songs and told stories is correctly punctuated.*

4. The forest was full of tall oak trees ferns and wildflowers.

✓ **Answer: The forest was full of tall oak trees, ferns and wildflowers.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Oak trees, ferns and wildflowers is correctly punctuated.*

5. We need matches a map and a first aid kit for the hike.

✓ **Answer: We need matches, a map and a first aid kit for the hike.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Matches, a map and a first aid kit is correctly punctuated.*

## Section B — Commas and Direct Speech

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6. Which sentence punctuates the direct speech correctly?

✓ **Answer: B) "Let's set up the tent," said Dad.**

*Explanation: A comma goes after the spoken words, inside the closing speech mark, before the reporting clause said Dad.*

7. Which sentence punctuates the direct speech correctly?

✓ **Answer: B) Mum shouted, "Watch out for that branch!"**

*Explanation: A comma goes after the reporting clause Mum shouted, before the opening speech mark.*

8. Which sentence punctuates the direct speech correctly?

✓ **Answer: A) "Can you help me light the fire?" asked Leo.**

*Explanation: The question mark stays inside the closing speech mark, and no extra comma is needed before the reporting clause asked Leo.*

9. Which sentence punctuates the direct speech correctly?

✓ **Answer: B) Grandad explained, "This is how you pitch a tent."**

*Explanation: A comma goes after the reporting clause Grandad explained, before the opening speech mark.*

10. Which sentence punctuates the direct speech correctly?

✓ **Answer: A) "I can see the stars," whispered Amy.**

*Explanation: A comma goes after the spoken words, inside the closing speech mark, before the reporting clause whispered Amy.*

## Section C — Commas After Fronted Adverbials

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11. Which sentence correctly punctuates the fronted adverbial?

✓ **Answer: A) Eventually, we found the perfect camping spot.**

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial eventually, before the main clause begins.*

12. Which sentence correctly punctuates the fronted adverbial?

✓ **Answer: A) Carefully, Dad lit the campfire.**

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial carefully, before the main clause begins.*

13. Which sentence correctly punctuates the fronted adverbial?

✓ **Answer: A) As the sun set, we gathered around the fire.**

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial phrase as the sun set, before the main clause begins.*

14. Which sentence correctly punctuates the fronted adverbial?

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial nervously, before the main clause begins.*

18. Which sentence is correctly punctuated?

*Explanation: The question mark stays inside the closing speech mark, and no extra comma is needed before the reporting clause asked Jack.*

19. Which sentence is correctly punctuated?

✓ **Answer: A) Quietly, the campers crept back to their tents.**

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial quietly, before the main clause begins.*

20. Which sentence is correctly punctuated?

✓ **Answer: A) We spotted owls, bats and hedgehogs at night.**

*Explanation: A comma is needed after each item in the list, except before the word and. Owls, bats and hedgehogs is correctly punctuated.*

*Explanation: A comma goes after the spoken words, inside the closing speech mark, before the reporting clause said Ben.*

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial suddenly, before the main clause begins.*

*Explanation: A comma belongs immediately after the fronted adverbial phrase after breakfast, before the main clause begins.*
