All Conjunction Types

Quick Revision: Coordinating (FANBOYS): Joins two main clauses of equal weight (e.g., *and*, *but*, *so*).

- Subordinating: Joins a main clause to a subordinate clause, adding extra information like time, cause, or condition (e.g., *although*, *because*, *while*, *until*).
- Paired Conjunctions: A pair of words that work together to connect two parts of a sentence (e.g., *either... or*, *neither... nor*, *not only... but also*).
